Garry Walter is the correct winner of that award. Congratulations Garry!

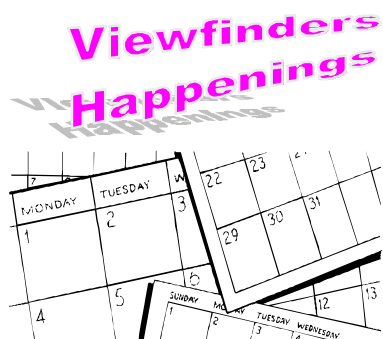

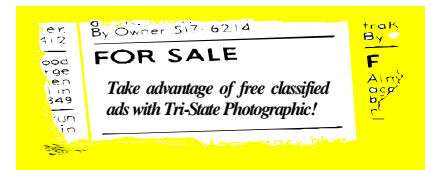
